Rationale

This inquiry-based unit invites learners to explore the **social, cultural, and economic history of the Llynfi Valley**, with a focus on how traditions, industry, and regeneration have shaped the community's identity. By examining local customs such as the **Mari Lwyd**, the impact of **industrial decline**, and efforts toward **regeneration**, pupils develop a deeper understanding of **change and continuity**, and their own place within the community. The unit supports the **Humanities Area of Learning and Experience**, particularly the statements of what matters around **identity, place, and change over time**. It also fosters **critical thinking, historical enquiry**, and **active citizenship**, encouraging learners to connect past and present through meaningful, locally relevant experiences.

Cross-curricular opportunities:

Literacy/ DCF: Pupils create a short documentary or podcast about the tradition's importance to the community.

Numeracy: Use graphs and charts to explore population changes, employment trends.
