| Inquiry: Justice Quest | Question: What is injustice and inequality? | |
| Rationale | | |
| This inquiry empowers learners to explore the concepts of injustice, inequality, and human rights , both locally and globally. Through critical thinking, role play, and real-world case studies, pupils investigate how inequality affects individuals and communities, and how organisations—including charities and the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) —work to promote fairness and protect rights. The inquiry encourages learners to become ethical, informed citizens who understand their rights and responsibilities and are motivated to contribute to positive change. It integrates digital competence through programming tasks using J2Code , and links to Operation Christmas Child as a practical way to explore empathy, giving, and global awareness during the festive season. | | |
