


Homework Survey Summer Term 2024

Many thanks to the parents / carers who completed the homework survey to express views and opinions. We had 78 responses from 125 families and one response equates to 1.3%. Please find below the results of the survey and a summary of the comments. Following discussions with staff and pupils , further information / proposals will be sent out to consultation.



8. My child enjoys doing his/her homework



13. What would you like to see as homework for your child? What is important to you as a regular reinforcement of learning?

Homework that is enjoyable but educational.

Literacy and numeracy tasks only. Activities that are more practical and linked to outdoors.

Giving a choice of tasks so that they become more independent learners.

Homework should not be compulsory. It should be linked to pupils' strengths and weaknesses in order for them to improve key skills.

Spellings, reading, handwriting, ICT games, numeracy tasks. Weekly flashcards to help with practising reading and spelling.

More creative, hands on tasks. Art and craft activities.

Homework should not be given at all.

More tasks linked to Welsh heritage and local points of interest.

Although we enjoy the crafty type of homework, sometimes, it can be difficult to find the materials for it and can sometimes be a bit expensive. This can lead to slight stress at home then which I think can be problematic for learning. I feel the homework that either gets materials sent home with the child or is all on the app is much easier to tackle.

General life skills, counting money, telling the time, making simple food, fun physical games/competitions with parents/ other pupils.

Continue to offer a range of relevant and interesting activities to maintain motivation and engagement.

Important that pupils see the link between what is learnt at school and at home otherwise they don't see the point of homework at all.

No homework. Just let children play!

14. Please add any additional comments/ideas/suggestions that you may have about homework.

Set homework on a Monday and give a week to complete.

It is important that homework is viewed and marked. No feedback from the class teacher is not encouraging children to complete work set.

Use the homework books given out at the start of term rather than completing online.

No homework to be given during school holidays.

Homework set less frequently and given a longer period of time to complete if it meant that the work was more tailored to the needs of individual children.

More of a show and tell about things they enjoy or tasks or days out they have had over the weekend.

I feel sometimes homework is given just for the sake of it and not relevant to what he/she has been learning. I would rather homework be optional.

Time is precious, let us enjoy it with the children.

More explanation of school work and how the homework is linked would help ease the conversation at home to assist parents in developing a good relationship with homework and their child giving up their spare time.

Homework isn't always challenging but it has provided opportunities for practising an element of their learning where additional practice is needed.

I believe there should be no repercussions for the child at this age if homework is not completed on time and conversations with parents should be had if this is a regular occurrence.

Homework online can be tricky to fit in if my other child also has online homework as we only have one laptop and they have to take it in turns.

Physical tasks that get kids moving rather than having to sit down and put pen to paper which they do enough of in school. I think it would be easier for parents to get the kids to engage in such homework and to be able to do these tasks together.
