Communication with parents/carers

We aim to share information with parents/carers in a timely manner and there are two main forms of communication. Whole school information, reminders and school trip details will be sent via our School Gateway app. We also use this app to make online payments for trips and visits. Please ensure that you have downloaded this app in order to receive the most up-to-date information and contact Ms Delve in the office should you experience issues with set up.



We also use Seesaw to share photographs of your child's learning, trips/visits, key events and achievements. Log in details have already been shared so please ensure that you use the QR code to join the Seesaw app. If you have any questions, or are unable to log in, please speak to your child's class teacher.

At Cwmfelin, staff work tirelessly to provide the best quality education for all pupils.

Should queries arise, we are keen to work with you in order to resolve issues as quickly as possible. We kindly request that emails outlining concerns are not sent to the admin email address as they are not always picked up. The correct procedure is to speak directly to your child's class teacher in the first instance either at the end of the school day or by telephoning to arrange an appointment. Members of staff, including myself, are also available in the yard every morning and are more than happy to speak to you and to answer any questions you may have. Many thanks for your cooperation.

School uniform

The children have returned to school looking very smart in their Cwmfelin uniform. May I remind parents that the school uniform colours are **red** and **grey**. Black trousers, skirts, leggings or tights are not permitted. School shoes should be sturdy and predominantly black and Converse footwear should not be worn. Nike Pro shorts of any colour are not appropriate uniform and should also not be worn. We take great pride in our Cwmfelin uniform which ensures that all our pupils feel part of our community and would very much appreciate your support to ensure that the correct items are worn.

Healthy schools

- We continue to promote healthy habits at Cwmfelin and children are expected to bring a daily fruit snack and a bottle containing water only. Squash or flavoured water is not permitted.
- Children in Nursery, Reception, Class 1 and Class 2 are offered a daily third pint of milk which they are encouraged to drink. Pupils with allergies are permitted to bring an alternative such as soya milk.
- Due to pupils with allergies, we are also a nut-free school and products containing nuts are not to be put into lunchboxes, including Nutella sandwiches. This also applies to packed lunches prepared for school trips.
